600 NEW COMMUTER CAR SPACES AT HILLS SHOWGROUND METRO

The NSW Government today announced 600 new commuter car parking spaces are ready at the new Hills Showground Metro station ahead of the first turn-up-and-go train services between Rouse Hill and Chatswood.

Member for Castle Hill Ray Williams said the three-level multi-storey car park has been completed as part of the \$8.3 billion Sydney Metro Northwest line, which will open within months.

“The new Sydney Metro will revolutionise how we get around our great city,” Mr Williams said.

“This includes 4000 new commuter car spaces – including 600 at Hills Showground.”

The new commuter car park is fully accessible for people with reduced mobility and has also been safeguarded for electric vehicle charging facilities.

“This is an exciting time for the Castle Hill community with two metro stations about to open,” Mr Williams said.

“It’s great news for locals who will benefit from this incredible transport project which will improve access to the north west and become a major hub as the local precinct is redeveloped.”

The car park has been designed to get people in and out quickly and use the latest technology.

Sydney Metro is being extended from the north west into the CBD, with services to start in 2024 – when Sydney will have 31 metro station and a new 66km standalone metro railway.
