PUBLIC TRANSPORT BOOST FOR CUSTOMERS

Customers travelling from the Hills are set to benefit from more weekly bus services.

Member for Castle Hill Ray Williams today announced a boost in services for customers travelling on buses and trains from the end of November.

"The NSW Government is not just delivering mega projects like Sydney Metro Northwest for Hills residents, we are also putting more and more services into the timetable,"

The NSW Government is committed to delivering better public transport services and from 26 November we'll be seeing one of the largest uplifts in services that Sydney has ever seen," said Mr Williams.

"These extra services are designed to encourage customers to leave the car at home and catch public transport by providing them with more options around when and how they travel.

"To meet the demand from customers, we've added additional services to both routes 607X and 619 during morning weekday peak periods on weekdays.

"An additional 10 weekly services have been added to route 607X from Rouse Hill to the Sydney CBD via the M2, while five additional weekly services have been added to the 619 for customers between Rouse Hill, Castle Hill and Macquarie Park.

Changes to bus, ferry and rail timetables may result in some minor changes to other existing timetables to provide better connections to other services. Customers should plan their journey ahead by visiting www.transportnsw.info, using the trip planning apps on their mobile devices or phoning the Transport Info Line on 131 500.

Since March 2011 the NSW Government has introduced more than 27,000 extra public transport services across NSW.
