BERALA STATION UPGRADE MOVES FORWARD

Parliamentary Secretary to the Premier for Western Sydney, Ray Williams, today announced the release of a tender for the design and construction of a major upgrade of Berala Station.

The Berala Station upgrade will include a new lift, family accessible toilets, way-finding signs, lighting and new CCTV to boost access and security.

“Companies will now be invited to submit their plans for how they will deliver the upgrade,” Mr Williams said.

“The NSW Government will assess the tenders and select the company that best demonstrates their ability to deliver the projects efficiently.

“This is a huge boost for thousands of Berala customers, especially older people, people with a disability and parents with prams,” Mr Williams said.

“This upgrade at Berala Station will make catching public transport a much more attractive option.

“As a next step, the community will be invited to provide their feedback on planning documents once they are placed on public display,” Mr Williams said.

“We expect to be able to award contracts for the work early next year.”

The upgrade is being delivered as part of the NSW Government’s Transport Access Program, an initiative to deliver modern, safe and accessible transport infrastructure.

Other projects recently delivered under the Transport Access Program in Western Sydney include a major bus interchange upgrade and commuter car park at Fairfield Station, new commuter car parks at Glenbrook, Granville and Canley Vale, and accessibility upgrades at Ingleburn, Riverstone, Canley Vale, Clarendon and Mulgrave stations.

An upgrade was also recently completed at Bankstown Station.
