## FUNDING ANNOUNCED - 2021 COMMUNITY BUILDING PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM

The electorate of Castle Hill has secured \$400,000 in funding for a total of 26 projects through the NSW Government's 2021 Community Building Partnership Program.

Member for Castle Hill Ray Williams MP said the State Government funds will deliver much-needed improvements to local facilities including repairing roofs, resurfacing floors, replacing play equipment and improvements to disability access to facilities.

"This is fantastic news for the Castle Hill electorate. This grassroots funding will directly help create a more vibrant and inclusive local community with positive social, environmental and recreational outcomes," Mr Williams said.

"I congratulate all the organisations that were successful in their application and look forward to seeing how these projects make a real difference for community groups in the area."

The Community Building Partnership program has funded more than 16,000 community projects since it commenced in 2009.

In 2022, there is \$400,000 to allocate in each electorate. Applications for the 2022 Program open in early 2022.
