FUNDING APPROVED TO MODERNISE CASTLE HILL PUBLIC SCHOOL

Funding has now been approved to progress to delivery of new permanent teaching spaces and student amenities as part of a significant upgrade to Castle Hill Public School.

Member for Castle Hill Ray Williams said the upgraded public school will deliver modern resources for our students now and into the future.

"This government is delivering a pipeline of school infrastructure projects to help cater for population growth in Western Sydney by planning new and upgraded schools now, and into the future," Mr Williams said.

Minister for Education and Early Learning Sarah Mitchell said the community was excited the longer-term need for local schools in the area is being met.

"Western Sydney is a growing area and we are delivering on our commitment to give local students the latest facilities and support the growing school community," Ms Mitchell said.

"The 2021/22 NSW Budget included funding for 22 new and upgraded school projects across Western Sydney, including at Castle Hill Public School. I'm proud to be part of a government that is delivering for these local communities."

The NSW Government is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.
